These supplementary regulations and attached entry form are important documents, which affect your legal rights and obligations. Read these documents carefully and do not sign the ENTRY FORM for this competition unless you are completely satisfied that you understand the contents and agree to be bound by them.

**1. ANNOUNCEMENT & JURISDICTION**

The WAMX Committee & Southern Capes Motorcycle Club known as the PROMOTERS, will conduct the meeting in accordance with the GENERAL COMPETITION RULES OF MOTORCYCLING AUSTRALIA (GCR's), these supplementary regulations & any additions or amendments approved by Motorcycling Western Australia (MWA).

**2. OFFICIALS**

Officials are appointed with the approval of MWA. Control will be under the Clerk of Course with the supervision from the Steward/s of the meeting who reserve the right to alter, postpone or cancel all or part of the event program if required, without notice.

**3. ELIGIBLE Championship & Support CLASSES**

1. Junior 90cc 2 Stroke - 110cc 4 Stroke **Standard 7 years to U/13yrs** (Capacity class rules apply ie 5% Tolerance, OEM engine cases and frames) (Round 2 points towards four round series)
2. Junior 90cc 2 Stroke - 110cc 4 Stroke **Modified 9 years to U/13yrs** (Capacity class rules apply ie 5% Tolerance, OEM engine cases and frames) (Round 2 points towards four round series)
3. Junior 200cc 2 Stroke - 300cc 4 Stroke **12yrs to U/16yrs** (Capacity class rules apply ie 5% Tolerance, OEM engine cases and frames) (Round 2 points towards four round series)
4. Veterans 35+ Championship
5. Women's Quads Championship
6. Clubman A and B (round 1 points towards 3 round series)
7. Quad Championships( round 2 points towards 6 round series)
8. Demonstration Uncompetitive D Grade Seniors

3.1 Competitors licensed under other Federations (FMN) are eligible to enter, providing they receive a clearance from their FMN and have Insurance to FIM standard. All grades subject to nomination. Grades may be combined according to entries received.

Any riders from outside WA must have grading letter from their SCB supporting entry to class entered.

**3.2 JUNIORS**

Juniors - AGE DIFFERENCE OF GREATER THAN (4) FOUR YEARS MAY BE PERMITTED.

**3.3 90cc-110cc Modified & Standard race together scored separately**

Detuning of senior quads is not permissible  
 No hybrids and no self manufactured machines

#### 4. **NUMBER PLATES**

As per the GCR's All quads must have race number, centrally on the front and rear of the machine, all riders must have race number on their back (jersey or armour)

#### 5. **MINIMUM / MAXIMUM RIDERS**

The maximum number of entries that will be accepted per class is to be 20 as per GCR's.

The minimum number of entries to constitute a Junior Championship class is 5 riders, if under 5 riders enter the event it may still be run but Championship points will not be awarded. Classes may be run together to suit entries received subject to Sporting Panel Committee approval.

#### 6. **ENTRY FEES AND CONDITIONS**

##### 6.1 **CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES**

Entries will officially close 10 days prior to the event –28<sup>th</sup> April 2010, Entries maybe accepted 5 days prior to the event, but a \$50 Late Entry Fee will be Payable.

##### 6.2 **ENTRY FEES** {unless included in a series entry} Entry fees are per rider per class

Extra machine will be allowed but must go through machine examination in the time specified. Sponsors names will be accepted. Sponsors will be shown next to a rider's name in the program at the promoter's discretion.

IF YOU DO NOT PRESENT A PASS AT THE GATE BEFORE 10.00AM ON RACE DAY YOU WILL BE CHARGED THE NORMAL ADMISSION FEE ON THE DAY, THERE WILL BE NO REFUNDS OF ADMISSION FEES....

Only competitors who officially scratch themselves (8) days prior to the meeting shall be entitled to a refund. Refunds will incur a \$10 administration fee.

#### 7. **MACHINE EXAMINATION**

Pits will open 7am.

Machine examination from 7.00am to 8.00am.

All competitors must present themselves with their MA license, proof of current club membership and full riding gear for inspection. All riders must compete in Full length Motocross Boots, short boots will not be permitted.

Any machine not presented with all of the above requirements will be rejected!

ALL MACHINES MUST CONFORM TO THE GENERAL COMPETITION RULES. Machines may be measured; bore and stroke, and fuel samples taken at random. The steward will be responsible for the decision to measure machines on the day. Any machine may be measured at the request of the steward or under protest. It is a condition of entry that all cost will be borne by the entrant for machines measured under the instruction of the Steward.

All lights must be removed for motocross as per rule 22.3.0.1 p of GCR's

#### 8. **NOISE TESTING**

##### **AS PER RULE GCR 12.10**

To ensure compliance with GCR's and local environment regulations regular noise testing will be conducted at Motorcycling WA events. Machines may be tested for noise at this event. Please ensure your machine has a properly packed muffler and all after market exhausts meet the maximum noise levels as per GCR regulations.

#### 9. **TRANSPONDERS**

Transponders will be compulsory at this meeting. Transponders are either hired through your entry fee to the event, or can be purchased through AMB on (02) 9546 2606 or email [bwynner@amb-it.com](mailto:bwynner@amb-it.com). It is compulsory to have fitted a transponder bracket. Transponder brackets are available for purchase for \$15.00 at the event. You must supply your own cable ties.

Condition of entry:

1. When a transponder is transferred to the competitor, it is the competitor's responsibility for any repairs or replacement cost of the transmitter if damaged or lost.

2. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure the transponder is mounted correctly, and securely to prevent damage from fouling other components on the machine.
3. It is the competitor's responsibility transponders are returned in good condition at the end of the event, or if due to machine failure or injury before the machine leaves the pit area. Competitors WILL be fined \$50 for not returning transponders on the day.
4. Transponders must be returned to the designated person as advised at the riders briefing.
5. For transponders not returned on the same day, or not returned to the designated person, in addition to the \$50 fee, the hirer is responsible for the transponder until it arrives back at the MWA office. This includes while in transit with Australia Post and by Courier. No excuse will be entertained for non-delivery. It is recommended transponders be hand-delivered.
6. Transponders must be fitted for all practice sessions.

NOTE: The onus is on guardian/rider to ensure transponders are on bikes prior to each event. Please download order forms from [www.motorcyclingwa.org.au](http://www.motorcyclingwa.org.au) and forward to MWA.

## 10. RACE CONDITIONS

The promoters reserve the right to postpone, cancel or change the program if necessary with MWA approval prior to the meeting or with permission from the Steward on the day of the meeting. Control will be under the Clerk Of Course with supervision from the Steward. A riders meeting will be held 8.15am and all riders must attend.

### 10.1 PRACTICE

Practice will commence at 8.30am for all classes. Minimum 3 laps, time permitting.

### 10.2 START METHOD

- a. Machines shall be placed on the starting line. The starter will hold up a green flag and from this moment the riders are under his control.
- b. Hold up a Fifteen (15) second board for a full fifteen (15) seconds.
- c. At the end of Fifteen (15) seconds, a five (5) second board will be displayed.
- d. The gate will then drop between five (5) to ten (10) seconds after the five (5) second board is shown

### 10.3 METHOD OF FINISH -

At the completion of the allotted time for each class, the leading rider is to be shown a ONE lap board indicating that ONE lap remains. The chequered flag is displayed to signal the race is completed.

### 10.4 CHANGE OF MACHINE

A change of machine is permitted as per GCR's on the condition that **written** notification must be in the hands of the Clerk of the Course at least 10 minutes prior to the race in which the substitution is to be made and further, that the replacement machine must have been correctly entered, examined and passed at machine examination. Machine must be the same capacity.

### 10.5 PROTESTS

All protests shall be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$70.00 (refer GCR's).

### 10.6 JUNIORS

The right to protest lies only with the rider, who should indicate prior to leaving the circuit that they wish to lodge an official protest by use of the purple protest flag and/or an official at the exit point of the race circuit.

### 10.7 SENIORS

All senior protests should be lodged in accordance with the GCR's

## 11. AWARDS

Trophies will be issued for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> in each Junior Championship class where five (5) or more entries are received (Round 2 will be awarded medallions). If there are less than 5, then the classes may be combined. When two classes are combined prizes are awarded at the discretion of the promoter. Trophy Presentation will take place after four championship rounds have been completed. All Senior Trophies to be presented at WAMX Presentation Dinner

## **12. FIRST AID**

An ambulance service will be in attendance. It is a condition of entry that First Aid MUST be accepted wherever deemed necessary by the attending first aid officers. The Clerk of Course has the right to refuse further participation if first aid treatment is refused.

### **12.1 Medical Clearances**

Any rider transported via Ambulance or private vehicle will require a medical certificate stating they are fit to participate in Motorcycle Sport. The Steward will collect information from the injury reports and relay this to the MWA office where it will be recorded that you require a certificate before you can compete in any further events and your name placed on a Medical Suspension list. The Medical Suspension list will be made available to all clubs and promoters.

### **12.2 Ambulance Cover**

All riders are reminded that ambulance cover is compulsory as a condition of your licence. Cover must be maintained for the duration of your licence. Riders please ensure your Ambulance Insurance cover is adequate for transport by any Ambulance service provider. i.e. St Johns Ambulance – Advanced Life Ambulance etc.

## **13. NO HASSLE POLICY**

Any rider or entrant or person associated with the rider or entrant shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner. A rider shall be responsible for his own conduct and that of any person with whom he is associated. Anyone who abuses or threatens personally or physically any official or any other person present at the event shall be deemed to be in Breach of this rule. The Steward for a breach of this rule may impose PENALTIES on the day of this meeting i.e.: \*Reprimand or warning.\*Fine.\*Expulsion from the meeting.  
All breaches will be reported to MA for possible further action.

## **14. CROSSING THE CIRCUIT**

Competitors are reminded that crossing the circuit during racing or practice is strictly prohibited.

## **15. MECHANICS' AREA (EXCLUDES JUNIORS)**

This is the only area where mechanics can get trackside to signal their riders, and if necessary, assist with mechanical problems without being penalized. Change of goggles/gloves is permitted in this area only. Riders will be advised of this area at the riders meeting.

## **16. ABSENTEEISM & MALINGERING**

In accordance with the GCR's any rider who enters for any competition and who fails to be present at the start must advise either the Steward or MWA of the scratching and submit a reasonable explanation or a penalty may be imposed.

## **17. DOPING TESTS**

All competitors and officials are advised that as part of the MA drug education program, drug testing may take place at any of these events in accordance with Australian Sports Commission policy as Implemented by the Australian Sports Drug Agency. If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors telephone the Drugs in Sport Hotline 1800020506

## **18. INSURANCE**

The National Personal Accident policy provides basic cover for death and permanent disability. Additional insurance is the responsibility of individuals. IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED COMPETITORS GIVE DUE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT SUCH INSURANCE COVER.

## **19. GENERAL RULES**

**19.1** No alcoholic beverages allowed in pits or racing circuit.

**19.2** There will be no riding of bikes other than on the track.

**19.3** Machines must be pushed to and from vehicles and in and out of the riders paddock. Engine may be running to assist

**19.4** Dogs will not be permitted (except guide dogs).

**19.5** Machines must remain in pits for the duration of the days racing, unless permission has been granted by the Steward to remove the machine. Riders of machines removed without authority may be excluded and all points forfeited for the day's event and/or incur a fine of up to \$100.00.

**19.6** Enclosed footwear must be worn in the pits at all times.

**19.7** NO pushbikes or scooters permitted within the premises.

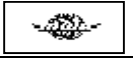

## CONTRACT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 2010 WA STATE MOTOCROSS CHAMPIONSHIPS

**WARNING! THIS IS AN IMPORTANT DOCUMENT WHICH AFFECTS YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS, PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY AND DO NOT SIGN IT UNLESS YOU ARE SATISFIED YOU UNDERSTAND IT.**

1. I THE UNDERSIGNED (see below): [Insert Name]

HEREBY AGREE with Motorcycling Australia Limited ("MA") that I am by this agreement entitled to participate in the motorcycle activity/meeting listed in Schedule 2 (hereinafter called "the Meeting" or the "Event") at the venue listed at Schedule 3 (hereinafter called "the Venue") on the terms and conditions set out in this document.

### 2. DEFINITIONS

- In this declaration:
- "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand, damage, cost or expense however arising including but not limited to negligence but does not include a claim against a Motorcycling Organisation under any right expressly conferred by its constitution or regulation;
  - "Indemnitees" means and includes the persons, organisations and bodies corporate whose names appear in Schedule 1.
  - "MA" means Motorcycling Australia Limited;
  - "State Controlling Body" (SCB) means a state or territory motorcycling association affiliated as a member of MA;
  - "Motorcycling Activities" means performing or participating in any capacity in any authorised or recognised Motorcycling Organisation event, meeting or activity;
  - "Motorcycling Organisation" means and includes MA, and the MA members (including the SCBs and affiliated clubs) and where the context so permits, their respective directors, officers, members, servants or agents.

### 3. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISKS, DANGERS & OBLIGATIONS

#### I ACKNOWLEDGE that:

- motorcycle sport is dangerous and that by engaging in the sport (whether as a competitor, recreational rider, coach, official or media) at the Meeting I take and am exposed to certain risks and dangers and am under certain obligations as follows:
  - that I may be injured, physically or mentally, and may be killed;
  - that my machinery or equipment may be damaged, lost or destroyed;
  - that competitors may ride dangerously or with a lack of skill;
  - that track or event conditions may be hazardous and may vary without warning or predictability;
  - that organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of meetings are frequently obliged to make decisions under pressure of time/or events;
  - that any policy of insurance of or in respect of my life or physical or mental health may be voided;
  - that there may be no or inadequate facilities for treatment or transport of me if I am injured;
  - that I have an obligation to myself and to others to act safely and within the rules and regulations of MA;
- the Indemnitees do not make any warranty that the services at the Meeting will be provided with due care and skill or that any materials provided in connection with the services will be fit for the purpose for which they are supplied;
- to the extent that any warranty is implied it is excluded to the full extent permitted by law;
- have voluntarily read and understood this warning and accept and assume the inherent risks in participating in the Event.

### 4. WARNING UNDER THE FAIR TRADING ACT 1999 (VIC)

Under the provisions of the Fair Trading Act 1999 (Vic) several conditions are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services. These conditions mean that the supplier named on this form is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to you are:  
- rendered with due care and skill;  
- as fit for the purpose for which they are commonly bought as it is reasonable to expect in the circumstances; and  
- reasonably fit for any particular purpose or might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the supplier.  
Under section 32N of the Fair Trading Act 1999, the supplier is entitled to ask you to agree that these conditions do not apply to you. If you sign this form, you will be agreeing that your rights to sue the supplier under the Fair Trading Act 1999 if you are killed or injured because the services were not rendered with due care and skill or they were not reasonably fit for their purpose, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form.

**NOTE:** The change to your rights, as set out in this form, does not apply if your death or injury is due to gross negligence on the supplier's part. "Gross

negligence" is defined in the Fair Trading (Recreational Services) Regulations 2004.  
For the purposes of the clause 3, "the Supplier" shall mean and include the Indemnitees.

### 5. INDEMNITY AND RELEASE GIVEN TO ORGANISERS

- IN CONSIDERATION of the acceptance of me as a participant in the Meeting:
- I AGREE TO INDEMNIFY AND KEEP INDEMNIFIED to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnitees and each of them in the following manner:
    - that I participate in the meeting at my sole risk and responsibility;
    - that I accept the Venue as it stands with all or any defects hidden or exposed;
    - that I indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnitees, their respective servants, agents, officials and competitors against any actions, costs, losses or claims which may be made by me or on my behalf for or in respect of or arising out of my death or any injury loss or damage caused to me or my equipment whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other manner whatsoever.
  - I AGREE TO RELEASE to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnitees and each of them from all liability to me for any claim, loss, damage, cost or expense (whether arising under statute, from negligence, personal injury, psychological trauma, death, property damage or infringement of third party rights or otherwise) that arises as a result of any act, matter or thing done, permitted or omitted to be done by me or which is in any way connected with my presence at or involvement in the Event.
  - The release and indemnity provided by me in this declaration is in addition to, and will not in any way limit the application of, the conditions of sale attaching to tickets, conditions of entry, conditions of credentials or any other applicable terms or conditions in respect of the Event.
  - A term of this release and indemnity will not apply where the term contravenes the law of the relevant jurisdiction under which any legal action is legitimately taken however such terms are severable and do not invalidate the remaining terms.

### 8. MEDICAL

- I declare that I am and must continue to be medically and physically fit and able to participate in the Meeting. I will immediately notify MA in writing via my SCB of any change to my fitness and ability to participate. I understand and accept the Indemnitees will continue to rely upon this declaration as evidence of my fitness and ability to participate.
- I acknowledge and agree that if required, the Indemnitees (or any of them) may arrange medical or hospital treatment (including ambulance transportation) for me. I authorise such actions being taken by the Indemnitees and agree to meet all costs associated with such action. I understand it is compulsory for me to have ambulance insurance in some form and I accept responsibility for the cost of ambulance transportation, ambulance cover and further agree to maintain ambulance cover during the term of my license / membership.

### 10. PRIVACY

I hereby consent to the collection of my personal information by the WAMX, MA and the SCB in connection with my involvement at the Event and the use and disclosure of my personal information by WAMX and MA to other agencies and officials associated with the Event for the purposes of conducting and managing the Event. I understand that I may gain access to my personal information held by WAMX by contacting WAMX at WAMX or MA at 147 Montague St, South Melbourne, Victoria, 3205. I understand that if I do not provide the personal information requested above that I may not be permitted to participate in the Event.

### 11. PERSONAL HEALTH INFORMATION

### 12. POLICIES AND REGULATIONS

- I acknowledge, understand and agree that it is a condition of my participation in the Event that I agree to be bound by, and subject to, the rules, regulations and jurisdiction of MA as amended from time to time. This involves the taking of a sample (any human biological fluid or tissue whether alive or otherwise, or any human breath) for the purpose of detecting the use of a Prohibited Drug or Doping Method. Any participant infringing MA's policy or refusing a drug test may be disqualified or otherwise dealt with in accordance with the terms of the anti-doping policy.
